Decision made by the Ministry for Welfare and Health
concerning the denaturants used in the preparation of denatured ethanol

The Ministry for Welfare and Health has decided based on the Government Decree (1345/94), section 2, subsection 2 on alcoholic preparations and denaturation issued on 22 December 1994:

1 §
Application

The denaturants and the quantities of denaturants in preparation of denatured ethanol are determined with this decision.

2 §
Denaturants and their quantities

In the list of denaturants that accompanies this decision are named the denaturants that are to be used in the preparation of denatured ethanol.

In the process of preparing denatured ethanol the denaturants are to be used in the way that the finished denatured ethanol contains at least one of the named denaturants and at least the quantity mentioned in the denaturants list per hectolitre of ethyl alcohol.

Decree of the Ministry for Welfare and Health
concerning the alteration of the decision the Ministry for Welfare and Health has issued on the
denaturants used in the preparation of denatured ethanol

According to the decision given by the Ministry for Welfare and Health,
the list of denaturants that accompanies the decision (892/1995) given by the Ministry for Welfare
and Health on 21 June 1995 *is to be altered* as follows:

List of denaturants

- 1) denaturant no 1, menthol 0,2 kilograms
- 2) denaturant no 2, peppermint oil 0,2 kilograms
- 3) denaturant no 3, turpentine 0,7 litres
- 4) denaturant no 4, benzine 2 litres
- 5) denaturant no 5, acetic ether 3 litres
- 6) denaturant no 6, diethyl phthalate 0,5 kilograms
- 7) denaturant no 7, acetone 3 litres
- 8) denaturant no 8, ethyl ether 5 litres
- 9) denaturant no 9, methyl ethyl ketone 2 litres
- 10) denaturant no 10, cyclo hexane 2 litres
- 11) denaturant no 11, acetone and methyl-isobutyl ketone together as follows: 1 litre of acetone
and 1 litre of methyl-isobutyl ketone
- 12) denaturant no 12, tertiary butyl alcohol 3 litres
- 13) denaturant no 13, normal butyl alcohol 3 litres
- 14) denaturant no 14, isobutyl alcohol 3 litres
- 15) denaturant no 15, methyl-isobutyl ketone 2 litres
- 16) denaturant no 16, denatonium benzoate 2 grams
- 17) National Product Control Agency for Welfare and Health can in special circumstances also
accept some other denaturant or a different way to denature if none of the above mentioned
denaturants is applicable to the use in question.

This decree enters into force on 15 March 2002.
